TECH TIPS FOR SUCCESSFUL PLASTIC STITCHING WITH THE MOTOR GUARD MAGNA STITCHER™

Model MS-1-KIT

This is not your father's plastic welder

Unlike the slow and tedious techniques of plastic welders and staplers currently on the market, the Motor Guard Magna Stitcher™ get's the job done FAST!

Due to the power of the stud welder, the time required to complete the job is a fraction of other methods. This stitching process is completed with a quick TAP or two of the trigger. It's like welding draw pins to a panel, only instead of squeezing, all that is needed is a short TAP on the trigger.



The Magna Stitcher™

After properly seating and securing the MS-1 adapter to the welder nose piece, set up a plastic panel and test a few stitches. Notice that sinking the stake only requires a fraction of a second, or a TAP on the trigger to complete. Watch the stake sink in as you make the first TAP.

If the stake is not halfway through the panel, TAP the trigger again. Usually 2 or 3 TAPS are all that's required. Remember to wait a few seconds of cool time before removing the tool from the stake.
